<u>Foster Progress:</u> Illinois program that provides assistance to youth with experience in foster care and tech support to professionals working with them.

Financial Aid Guide

<u>First Star Academy:</u> National organization that partners with specific communities to build a pipeline of support for youth with experience in foster care from high school to college. <u>First Star ISU Academy</u> is one of 12 national programs.

<u>Project STRIVE (Strategies to Rejuvenate Interest and Value in Education)</u>: Partnership between the Illinois Department of Children and Families and Chicago Public Schools. Youth Guidance Chicago serves approximately 200 youth annually.

Life Skills Program–Illinois Department of Children and Family Services: Assists youth aged 14-20 in developing life skills through training. Stipends are available to students to complete the training. <u>Tip Sheet</u>

<u>Brighter Futures–Illinois Department of Children and Family Services</u>: The Service Provider IDentification and Exploration Resource (SPIDER) is a free, comprehensive service resource database that connects you to nearby organizations offering services and supports to youth. TRIO Programs: Educational opportunity outreach programs designed to motivate and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds.
